## 2018 Rule Adoption for NJ LPCs, LACs, LCSWs, LSWs, LMFTs & LAMFTs (1 Hour Opioid Education)

New Jersey recently passed a Rule Adoption that requires all LPCs, LACs, LCSWs, LSWs, LMFTs and LAMFTs to receive 1 hour of continuing education on opioid use disorders (treatment, assessment and diagnosing, the societal problem impact). This course meets that continuing education requirement! This course covers the history of prohibition, differentiation of opiates and opioids, medication assisted treatments for opioid use disorders, and the dangers associated with use.

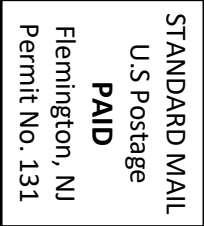
